

Inly School in Scituate, Massachusetts: BIPOC Artist in Residence Program

"The Inly School in Scituate, Massachusetts has an annual BIPOC Artist in Residence program where they host an artist for an 8-week teaching and creating residency for an \$8,000 stipend. In addition, they can provide housing if needed. Embedded in the community, the artist will provide in-classroom instruction to students (cost of these materials will be covered) at a variety of ages while simultaneously providing the artist their own space and time to create where students can observe and understand the artistic process."

"Reflecting our institutional commitment to advance diversity, equity, inclusion and justice, Inly's Artist in Residence program seeks to elevate, amplify, and support Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) artists. We ask that artists are at least 21 years of age and self-identified members of the BIPOC community."
