Request for Proposals – Mapping the Mental Health and Substance Use System of Care in the Northeast Kingdom of Vermont

Background: The Vibrant ONE (Orleans/Northern Essex) Accountable Health Community partnership has prioritized developing a set of goals to help improve the behavioral health (mental health / substance use) systems of care in Vermont's Northeast Kingdom (NEK). The results of a root cause analysis helped identify that there is a lack of understanding of exactly how our current system functions or is expected to function as well as a lack of awareness of formal and informal assets and resources. Additionally, no organization in the partnership has the capacity or expertise to take on this project at the present time.

Purpose: To help vision for the future, Vibrant ONE would like to accurately document the experience of individuals as they journey through the behavioral

health system of care as well as the critical decision points or system constraints that providers face as they try to help navigate an individual's treatment through the current system of care. Additionally, our group would like to document all the services and assets within our current system. It is hoped that this process/asset mapping will create a solid foundation for future visioning.


