

Special and Urgent Needs: Storms and Flooding Relief Funding

Nonprofit organizations impacted by storms and flooding may seek funding through the Foundation's Special and Urgent Needs (SUN) grant program. To support urgent nonprofit needs related to this disaster, we have temporarily modified the guidelines for the SUN program. For storms and flooding relief, organizations may request up to \$5,000. Grant awards will support:

> -> Physical and/or capital repairs -> Loss of revenue because of closure and/or canceled programs -> Tuition, camp, and/or program refunds -> Disruption of office functions and/or loss of critical information -> Damage to technology -> Unexpected expenses related to transportation disruption -> Efforts to support staff and/or volunteer health and wellbeing -> Or similar, urgent needs to be determined by the applicant

This funding is intended to support those organizations directly impacted by storms

and flooding.

FY2024 Building Communities Grants

The Building Communities Grants Program has been funded for FY2024. This program, administered by BGS, includes the following:

1) \$300,000.00 – Recreational Facilities Grant Program

- 2) \$300,000,00 Regional Economic Development Grant Program
 - 3) \$150,000.00 Human Services Facilities Grant Program

4) \$150,000.00 – Educational Facilities Grant Program

These grants are for construction and capital improvements to support and strengthen Vermont towns and regions. Descriptions, the application criteria, and the deadline for all four of these grant programs are available on the <u>BGS website</u>.

Applications are due September 10, 2023.



What is the Health Equity Stipend Program?

The NE Public Health Training Center provides stipends to 27 students per year for field placements and faculty-student collaborative projects throughout New England. To qualify you must be a graduate or doctoral student pursuing a degree in a health profession, or a 3rd or 4th year undergraduate student pursuing a public health degree, and work with a public health or nonprofit agency supporting underserved areas and populations. 
