Samara Fund

The Samara Fund is a community-directed fund that helps ensure lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ+) Vermonters are connected, healthy, appreciated, safe, and empowered. We make grants and scholarships annually based on recommendations from committees of LGBTQ+ volunteers from around the state.

Our values guide how we fund. We offer five distinct types of funding:

1.General organizational support

2.Project-specific support to organizations

3.Emergent (unplanned) needs for organizations

4.Sponsorship of queer events

5.Scholarships for LGBTQ+ high school students committed to positive change for LGBTQ+ people who seek to enroll at a four-year college or university, a career or technical college, or a vocational program

Applications for general and project-specific grants will be accepted between June 29, 2023 and August 31, 2023.

Applications must be received by 5PM on Thursday, August 31, 2023 to be considered.

Notifications and awards will be sent to applicants in October 2023.

Addison County, Brandon, and Statewide Funding Available through the Walter Cerf Community Fund

The Walter Cerf Community Fund makes grants to address charitable needs in the state of Vermont. Priority interests are the arts, education, historic preservation, and social services. Organizations are invited to request program/project support or general operating support.

Grants are made to organizations that either have a statewide constituency and make a unique contribution to Vermont, or are located in Addison County or Brandon. Approximately 70% of funds available will be awarded to programs and projects in the Addison County/Brandon area; the remaining 30% of available funds will support statewide programs and projects.

Applications will be accepted through 5 p.m. on Tuesday, June 20, 2023.

Grants \$500 - \$5,000; Large up to \$25,000 (Organizations must be serving Addison County or Brandon to be eligible to apply for the large grant.)

Maquam Bay of Missisquoi/Abenaki Nation of Missisquoi to begin drumming program to address mental health and substance use disorders

Maquam Bay of Missisquoi (MBM) was recently awarded \$30,000 from the Vermont Department of Health as part of its Rural Pilots to Address Mental Health and Substance Use Disparities grant program. The funding will allow MBM to develop monthly drumming programs for the community in an effort to combat the stigma around mental health issues and substance use disorders by bringing community together using culturally significant means and allowing MBM to build trust and authenticity while combating two serious conditions facing the community it serves.

The program will begin this summer and continue until May 2024.






